Smoking Also Affects Those Around You

Smoke from lit cigarettes and smoke exhaled from smokers contain many harmful substances, which affect even non-smokers in the area.

The risk is especially high for children in households with smokers. There are reports that they are more likely to develop asthma and allergies, and are at higher risk of sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS).



Smoking Cessation Consultations

The city provides information and consultation services to support those who wish to quit smoking.

Measures Against Unwanted Secondhand Smoke are Spreading



To protect non-smokers from the harmful effects of cigarettes, Japan has laws that prevent smoking in certain areas as a measure against secondhand smoke. In general, smoking indoors is prohibited in facilities that accommodate large numbers of visitors, ships and trains used for public

transportation, and restaurants.

In addition, smoking is generally prohibited on the premises of institutions, government offices and other facilities frequented by children and people with medical conditions, including outdoor areas.

Smoking Cessation Support/ Outpatient Services



Some pharmacies in the city offer smoking cessation support by pharmacists.

In addition, some medical institutions offer smoking cessation treatment covered by health insurance for those who meet certain criteria, such as the degree of nicotine dependence and smoking history. For more details, contact the pharmacies/medical institutions directly.

Payment Methods and Deadline of City Resident's Tax, Prefectural Resident's Tax and Forest Environment Tax

Those who are self-employed (regular collection: paid by individuals)

The City Resident's Tax/Prefectural Resident's Tax/Forest Environment Tax Payment Notification will be mailed out on Tuesday, June 10. To make a payment, bring the enclosed payment slip to the Urayasu City Office, a financial institution (banks, Shinkin banks, etc.), Japan Post Bank, convenience store (only accepts payment slips with a printed barcode), or use the smartphone payment app. If you have completed account transfer applications, the payment amount will be automatically deducted from the designated account on the payment due date.

Those with salaried income (special collection: deducted from salary and paid by company)

The amount listed on the Payment Amount Decision Notification for Special Collection of City Resident's Tax/Prefectural Resident's Tax/Forest Environment Tax Through Deduction from Salaried Income (sent to your company on May 9) will be deducted from your salary from June of that year to the following May. If you switch jobs, discuss the tax payment situation with your new employer.

Those who are 65 years old or above as of April 1, who have pension income and are subject to City Resident's Tax/Prefectural Resident's Tax/Forest Environment Tax payment (special collection: deducted from pension)

A designated amount will be deducted from your pension when they are paid out (six times a year).

The City Resident's Tax/Prefectural Resident's Tax/Forest Environment Tax Payment Notification, which lists the amount to be deducted, will be mailed out on Tuesday, June 10.

FY2025 Tax Payment (Non-payment) Certificate

The certificate can be issued at the Residential Tax Section (City Office 2F), Station City Service Centers and convenience stores (must have a My Number Card with the electronic certificate function activated) starting on Tuesday, June 10. Please note that those who pay through special collection from salaried income can only receive certificates at the Residential Tax Section. You will need a personal identification document (driver's license, etc.) to have a certificate issued. The issuing fee is 300 yen per copy.
