RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

For children to grow up healthy, they need protection and consideration from adults.

At the same time, children are not only to be protected – they are individuals who possess human rights.

The concept of guaranteeing children's rights is enshrined in the "Convention on the Rights of the Child," ratified by countries and regions worldwide. In Japan, following the spirit of the convention, the "Basic Act for Children" came to effect in April 2023.

FOUR GENERAL PRINCIPLES OF THE CONVENTION ON THE RIGHTS OF THE CHILD

Prohibition of Discrimination

All children are guaranteed all the rights set out in the Convention without discrimination of any kind, regardless of the child's or their parent's race, nationality, sex, opinions, disability, economic status, or any other status.

Best Interests of the Child

In all decisions and actions concerning children, the primary consideration is "what is in the child's best interests."

Right to Life, Survival, and Development

The right of every child to life must be protected, and children must have guaranteed access to healthcare, education, and support for their daily life so they can fully develop their innate abilities.

Respect for the Views of the Child

Children have the right to freely express their views on matters affecting them, and adults must give those views due weight in line with the child's age and maturity.

"I was also raised being hit by my parents since I was a child," or "I didn't let them eat dinner because they didn't listen." These kinds of thoughts and actions can lower a child's self-esteem and self-affirmation, and deprive them of opportunities to think and understand things for themselves. Even if intended as discipline or "for the child's good", any act that causes the child pain is not appropriate and constitutes "abuse."

To help develop a child's personality and talents so that they can grow up to lead an independent social life, use words to explain expectations.

A Stroll with the Mayor

Making the Keiyo Line More Convenient

Days of fluctuating temperatures continue. Please take good care of your health.

Railways are a one of the major factors leading to urban development.

In 1977, when large-scale residential development began,

and in 1983, when Tokyo Disneyland® opened, the only railway running through our city was the Tozai Line, and buses from Urayasu Station were the main intra-city transport.

With the Keiyo Line opening in 1988, convenience for the Nakamachi and Shinmachi areas greatly improved, powering our city's residential and urban resort development.

The Keiyo Line was initially planned as a freight-only line for the Keiyo Industrial Zone but was converted to a passenger line following requests from municipalities along its route. Today, the number of daily passengers is approximately 50,000 at Shin-Urayasu Station and about 80,000 at Maihama Station, serving as a vital mode of

transport for both our residents and visitors.

Currently, traveling from Shin-Urayasu Station to Haneda Airport via the Keiyo Line requires transfers – either at Tokyo Station to Hamamatsucho Station for the Tokyo Monorail, or at Shin-Kiba Station to the Rinkai Line and then again at Tennozu Isle Station for the Tokyo Monorail – taking over an hour including wait times.

To strengthen direct access to Haneda Airport from central Tokyo and other areas, JR East is planning three routes for the tentative Haneda Airport Access Line. One of these, the "Coastal Area Route," will utilize the existing freight lines to link Haneda Airport and Shin-Kiba via the Rinkai Line in about 20 minutes. Discussions with related parties are underway with the goal of opening this route simultaneously with the Higashi-Yamanote Route in fiscal year 2031.

When this route opens, travel between Shin-Urayasu -Haneda Airport journey will be reduced to a single transfer,

and the travel time is expected to be shortened by over 30 minutes.

The city has been requesting related organizations to enable mutual through-service between the Keiyo and Rinkai lines, which would allow transfer-free travel. Looking ahead to the opening of the tentative Haneda Airport Access Line, we will continue working to further improve the convenience of the Keiyo Line.
