# **Applications for Fiscal Year 2026 Regular Use** of Municipal Bicycle Parking Lots

Applications are being accepted for regular use of municipal bicycle parking lots from April 1, 2026, to March 31, 2027. If the number of applications exceeds capacity, users will be selected by lottery.

Application Period: Saturday, January 10 to Saturday, January 31 (applications must arrive by the deadline)

A second round of applications will be held from Thursday, March 5, to Tuesday, March 10, only for facilities that have vacancies after the initial recruitment.

# **Major Revisions to Individual** Residence Tax for Fiscal Year 2026

# **Review of Employment Income Deduction**

Starting with the FY 2026 residence tax, the minimum guaranteed deduction amount for individuals with annual employment income of ¥1,900,000 or less will be increased by up to

# Review of Income Requirements for Dependents, etc.

The income requirements for receiving various dependent deductions will be increased by ¥100,000.

# Establishment of a special deduction such as for university-aged children, called "Special Deduction for Specified Relatives"

Starting with the FY 2026 residence tax, individuals will be eligible for an income deduction even if the total income such as of their family members aged 19 to 22 (such as university students) is between ¥580,000 and ¥1,230,000 (equivalent to employment income of ¥1,230,000 to ¥1,880,000).

# File Your Income Tax Return from Home **Using Your My Number Card**

The venue for filing 2025 (Reiwa 7) income tax returns will be set up inside the Ichikawa Tax Office. When visiting, please make an advance reservation via LINE.

Note: The Tax Office parking lot will not be available from January to March 2026.

By using the "Preparation Corner for Final Tax Returns and Related Documents" on the National Tax Agency website (https://www.keisan.nta.go.jp/kyoutu/ky/sm/top), you can create and submit your income tax return via e-Tax simply by following the on-screen instructions and entering the required amounts.

Furthermore, by linking with Myna Portal, information related to your income and deductions can be automatically entered into your tax return.
