In order to avoid vaccine mix-up errors at the mass vaccination venue, Urayasu City will administer vaccines for those aged 5-11 years separately from those aged 18 years and older. For this reason, the Culture Hall will be used as a mass vaccination venue for those aged 5-11 years from the beginning of April, and booster shots (third dose) for those aged 18 years and older will end by March 31 (Thu.). For those who wish to receive a booster shot (third dose) after April, please sign up for an individual vaccination at either the Urayasu City Vaccination Center (next to Hinode Public Hall) or one of the selected medical facilities.

Urayasu City is sending out vaccination tickets to those aged 18 years and older, who have received their second dose at least six months ago. Those who have received their vaccination ticket can schedule an appointment for their booster shot (third shot) by calling the Novel Coronavirus Vaccine Call Center (Tel: 0120-151-670) or access the online vaccination reservation form (https://urayasu.hbf-rsv.jp).



The Legal Adult Age is Lowered from 20 to 18

Starting April 2022, the legal adult age has been lowered from 20 to 18. Persons born after April 2, 2004 will be legally considered as an adult on their 18th birthday, and will be able to sign credit card and mobile phone contracts on their own

without requiring parental consent. However, the legal age for alcohol consumption, smoking, and government-controlled gambling such as horse racing will continue to be 20 years of age considering the health impacts, juvenile delinquency, and juvenile protection. Furthermore, the legal age allow-





ing women to marry will be raised from 16 to 18, making 18 the marriageable age for both men and women. This decision has been influenced by the recent view of social and financial maturity being deemed the same for both genders.

Youths, shortly after reaching their adulthood, tend to lack knowledge and experience with contracts and are prone to hastily signing them without properly understanding the content. Up until now, contracts signed by persons under the age of 20 without parental consent could be in principle, cancelled. However, now with the legal adult age lowered, this protection will no longer apply for those aged 18 years and older. Please be firm in refusing contracts that you think are suspicious or unnecessary before signing them. Consult a trusted family member or friend if it is difficult for you to judge on your own. The Consumer Advisory Center is open for consultation regarding contracts, don't try to handle it on your own but seek advice by calling the Consumer Advisory Center Assistance Desk (Tel: 390-0030).


School Lunch Fees Are Exempt for 6th Graders at Municipal Elementary **Schools and 3rd Graders** at Junior High Schools



Adjustments Will Be Made to the Out-ofpocket Medical Expenses for the Latter-stage **Elderly**

A Stroll with the Mayor

An Educational Environment that Utilizes Tablet Devices

As the spread of the novel coronavirus infection continues to be highly unpredictable, we ask for your continued cooperation in taking all basic preventative measures.

The spread of the novel coronavirus infection has drastically changed our lives, limiting the kind of human interaction we used to have in the past.



The environment surrounding children has also changed completely. Through a process of trial and error, schools and other educational institutions have been working hard in order to best accommodate the children.

Two years ago, there was a temporary closure of all schools in April 2020, which changed the children's school life dramatically. How to carry out and continue classes, homerooms, and afterschool activities became a challenge. So, we established a website to assist children with their learning, also known as "Urayasu Learning Center" and distributed videos of school lessons.

Due to these circumstances, enhancing the ICT environment became imperative in order to support children's learning and maintain school activities. The "GIGA School Project" was accelerated, with an aim to provide one tablet device per student, use cloud computing, and set up a high-speed communi-

cation network environment. Urayasu City utilized government subsidies to complete preparations sooner than initially planned, by providing one tablet device per student and improving the school network environment as early as March 2021.

In addition to the preparation of tablet devices, efforts were being made to secure desirable learning environments. This meant, tablet devices and Wi-Fi routers were being lent out, interactive homerooms were carried out, online classes with external instructors were held, and devices were being utilized in school events. In 2021, each student was able to bring home a tablet device, in an effort to help establish a closer relationship between the school and students.

Even during this pandemic, we have been striving to ensure good opportunities for the children to learn. We will continue to promote the use of tablet devic es and online platforms, as we incorporate these new forms of learning in this age of advanced digitization.
