

Starting on Saturday, July 2, the vaccine developed by Novavax Inc. and manufactured by Takeda Pharmaceutical Company Limited will be available for the first three doses for those 18 years of age and older. Novavax vaccine is available at selected medical facilities in Urayasu City. For a list of medical facilities administering Novavax vaccines, please refer to the Urayasu City website.

Please note that the second dose of Novavax vaccination can be administered 21 days after the first dose. If you have received the first dose of Novavax vaccine, in principle, you are advised to receive the second dose of the same vaccine. The third vaccination can be given 6 months after the second vaccination, regardless of the type of vaccine given in the first or the second vaccination.

Note: Only Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are available for the fourth vaccination.

Global Warming and Heat Strokes

In recent years, extremely hot days have been observed on numerous occasions. This is presumably due to climate change as a result of global warming.

As we approach the hottest season of the year, let's be careful in avoiding heat strokes, while still taking reasonable energy-saving measures.

Suggestions for preventing heat strokes

- Refrain from unnecessary outings on extremely hot days. Have enough sleep and stay in good physical condition.
- Hydrate frequently.

- Be reasonable in taking energy-saving measures Since air conditioners account for a large portion of electricity usage in homes during the summer, they should be

used effectively and reasonably in order to promote en-

ergy-saving measures. Effective use of air conditioners

- ① Use a circulator or a fan to evenly circulate cool air from the air conditioner throughout the room.
- 2 Set airflow to "automatic" to avoid using excessive power.
- 3 Set the airflow direction to horizontal or upward to help the cool air circulate from the top of the room downwards.
- 4 Place the outdoor unit in a location without direct sunlight and ground glare, and do not place objects in front
- (5) When going out, close the curtains to prevent heat from entering into the room, and when returning home, ventilate the room before using the air conditioner in order to release the hot air inside.
- 6 Clean the filter every two weeks.

Beware of Animals and Pests

/!\ Wild Animals

Residents have reported that wild animals such as masked palm civets and raccoons were seen in the city. Sightings of masked palm civets are especially common, and we have received reports of damage, such as animal droppings being found. Additionally, raccoons can be aggressive and are listed among the "invasive alien species" specified by the Ministry of Environment.

When disposing household waste, securely seal the bags containing food waste and any other items that can be eaten, and rinse out empty cans before discarding them. In addition, harvest your garden produce and dispose any leftover pet food immediately.

Redback spiders and giant hornets are pests that are commonly sighted in Urayasu City. In consideration of safety, please do not hesitate to contact us if you wish to remove their hives or nests.

Updating the Eligibility Certificate for Ceiling-Amount

The Eligibility Certificate for Ceiling-Amount, in which you will pay for the co-payment up to a ceiling-amount, is only valid until July 31 (Sun.). Those who currently have an Eligibility Certificate for Ceiling-Amount and wish to renew it, must also re-apply. Once you receive your new Health Insurance Card, please visit the National Health Insurance & Pension Section (Urayasu City Hall 2F) with your card.

Delivery of Tax Notice

A tax notice for National Health Insurance of FY2022 will be sent to the head-of-household, dated July 13 (Wed.). We strongly advise you to make the payment by the specified due date.

We Ask for Your Understanding with Our Decisions Regarding Events

I would like to thank all residents of Urayasu City for your cooperation in preventing the spread of the novel coronavirus infection.

The number of newly infected cases in Urayasu City was at times as high as 200 per day during the sixth wave, but that has now decreased to an average of about 30 per day during these past seven days.

Nearly two and half years have passed since the spread of the novel coronavirus infection began. During this time, the lives of many in Urayasu City have been greatly affected. The pandemic has also significantly impacted the economy of Urayasu City, especially in the tourism industry.

Specifically, the temporary closure of schools, kindergartens, and nursery schools, as well as cancellations of various social events had a significant impact on our children's development. On the other hand, proactive measures were taken to support and

advance the learning environment, such as the implementation of tablet devices in schools.

At this moment, completely eliminating new infections and aiming to achieve a so-called "zero-COV-ID" community may be an unrealistic goal. Rather, we believe that it is more realistic to "co-exist with Coronavirus", aiming to control the numbers of newly infected cases to a low level and continue living our normal lives.

Through a trial and error process during these past two and half years of the pandemic, we learned many lessons and countermeasures to deal with the situation.

From here onwards, I believe that making use of the knowledge we have gained and acting appropriately will allow us to resume our daily activities.

If we were to return to our previous lifestyle all at once, we may risk increasing the spread of the novel

coronavirus infection. Therefore, while we all should maintain a high awareness for the risk of the infection, I believe we are approaching a period in which we can make efforts toward resuming our previous lifestyle.

As we are about to welcome the summer season, Urayasu City, various organizations, and council associations are preparing to host many events.

I am sure that many decisions will be made regarding future events, such as whether to host events while implementing preventative measures, or to postpone/cancel some events due to the risk of infection. Maintaining a balance between infection control and the resuming of daily activities is what underlies these decisions, and so we sincerely ask for your kind understanding.
