

Preparing for Wind and Flood Disasters

The season for heavy rain and strong winds caused by typhoons and sudden torrential rains is approaching. You may not know how to act when a disaster actually strikes. To prepare for wind and flood disasters, learn what actions you should take to avoid dangerous situations.

Points to note when evacuating



Watch your step

If roads are flooded, there may be dangers such as manholes and ditches that are difficult to see. Use a cane, umbrella, or other long object to check your footing while walking.

Avoid acting alone as much as possible

Evacuate in groups of two or more when possible. You can use a rope to connect each other to avoid becoming separated. Carry the elderly on your back and attach floatation rings to children to ensure safety.

Wear safe and comfortable clothing

If possible, protect your head with a helmet or disaster prevention hood. Wear sneakers with laces. It becomes harder to move if you are wearing boots and water gets in.

Urayasu City important information distribution service

Disaster prevention information and other information will be sent to you via LINE or email.

To receive information via LINE

Search for “浦安市 (Urayasu City)” in the search window or “@urayasu_city” in the ID search in the LINE app, select the Urayasu City account and tap the “友だちに追加 (Add Friend)” button.

To receive information via email

Send an empty email to login@urayasu.mailio.jp and register through the URL in the reply email. Note: If you have your spam filter on, make sure you set it so you can receive emails from the domain “city.urayasu.lg.jp”.

When to evacuate

There are five levels of flood evacuation alerts. Prepare a list of emergency supplies and items to take with you so that you can quickly evacuate at the appropriate time.

Emergency Safety Measures

Lives are in danger. Please ensure your safety immediately.

Evacuation Order

Everyone must evacuate from hazardous areas.

Evacuation for the Elderly, etc.

Senior citizens, the disabled, infants and their caregivers who require more time should evacuate from hazardous areas. Others should also voluntarily evacuate if they feel that they are in danger.

Heavy Rain, Flood, and High Tide Advisory

Change into clothes suitable for evacuation, prepare emergency supplies, and double check your evacuation plan.

Early Warning Information

Pay attention to the latest Disaster Prevention Weather Information updates, and be prepared for natural disasters.

If danger is approaching

The situation of wind and flood disasters can change rapidly. Make sure you know what actions to take so that you can respond immediately when the situation changes.

Strong wind

If you are on the street

Take shelter in a nearby sturdy building. Do not go to underground malls or the like if it is also raining.

If you are near the sea

There is a danger of falling into the sea or being caught in high waves. Get away from the seaside immediately and evacuate to a higher place. Note that you may not be able to hear the warnings during strong winds or heavy rain.

Heavy rain

If you are driving

Visibility becomes poor and maneuverability may become impaired. Drive near the center of the road where there is less water, and evacuate slowly to higher ground. If your engine stalls due to flooding, do not try to restart it. Consult with a car dealer before using the car again. Avoid roads that are lower than ground level, such as underpasses.

If the roads are flooding

Evacuate to a high floor of a building. Make sure to take the stairs and not the elevator.

Confirm the location of temporary retreat shelters

These shelters are temporary evacuation sites that you can go to if you are evacuating based on your own judgment in the event of a wind or flood disaster. The city opens these sites according to the situation.

First facilities to open (step 1)

Todayjima Public Hall, Chuo Public Hall, Horie Public Hall, Mihama Public Hall, Tomioka Public Hall, Hinode Public Hall, Takasu Public Hall, Minami Elementary School, Higashi Elementary School, Maihama Elementary School, Hokubu Elementary School

Next facilities to open (step 2)

Pet-friendly retreat centers Koutsu Park, Todayjima Public Hall car park

These will be selected out of school and public facilities, according to the situation.



Make an Appointment to Pick Up Your My Number Card as Soon as Possible

The deadline to apply for Myna Points is Saturday, September 30. It will become crowded and difficult to make an appointment to pick up your card as the deadline approaches, so please pick it up as soon as possible. Those who have applied for a My Number Card (individual number card) by the end of February 2023 are eligible for Myna Points.

Note: Conditions may change depending on circumstances.

Appointment procedures: An appointment must be made to receive your card.

When you receive the issuance notification, you can apply through the city website or by calling the Civic Affairs Section (Tel: 712-6249).

Note: In principle, you must come to the city hall in person to pick up the card. Please bring the following items with you when you pick up the card:

Issuance notification, personal ID such as your driver's license (see the issuance notification or the city website for more information), My Number notification card, basic resident registration card (if you have one)

The deadline to apply for Myna Points is Saturday, September 30.

Infant Bicycle Helmet Purchasing Aid Program

Partial subsidies (discount coupons) are provided for the purchase of infant bicycle helmets. The coupons will be mailed in mid-August. They can be used at the participating stores listed on the back of the coupons and on the city website.

A Stroll with the Mayor

Role of the East and West Sluice Gates of Sakaigawa River

Summer is approaching. The temperature is expected to be high again this summer, so please take precautions against heat stroke, such as hydrating frequently.

Additionally, during summer and fall, we must also prepare for typhoons and torrential rain.

In Urayasu City, which has a low altitude and surrounded by water on three sides, it is important to be aware of flood hazards. The city conducts proper operation and maintenance of sluice gates, drainage pump stations, pumping stations, and discharge gates to prevent internal flooding.

In the Motomachi area, where the altitude is especially low, two sluice gates are operated on the Sakaigawa River to keep the water level below a certain level.

The two sluice gates on the east and west sides of the Sakaigawa River were renovated as clamshell gates in 1953 after it was damaged by Typhoon Kitty in 1949.

Later, as subsidence progressed, the gates were renovated as roller gates, which open and close vertically. The west gate was completed in 1965 while the east gate was completed in 1966.

Although the two gates are owned by Chiba Prefecture, Urayasu City has been commissioned to manage the gates along with the drainage pump station. Based on tidal conditions, the gates are opened for approximately 230 days a year for about two hours each time to change the water.

Waterfronts are valuable recreational areas for our residents. In addition to opening the gates regularly, we request Chiba Prefecture to dredge the river bottom to remove sediment and other debris when necessary to improve water quality.

In conclusion, sluice gates have two roles: to manage water levels in preparation for flooding, and to replace

water in rivers to improve water quality.

Although we have received opinions from residents to open the gates more frequently to improve water quality, I hope this has given you a better understanding of the two roles of the east and west sluice gates of Sakaigawa River.
